**Collection Title:** Army Language School Historical Collection

Abstract: The Army Language School Historical Collection consists of 2.5 cubic feet of records regarding the history of the Army Language School (ALS) and the creation of DLIWC (Defense Language Institute-West Coast). Boxes 01 and 02 contain original "information bulletins" about basic situations, information for faculty members, a code of ethics for faculty, the Realia City, and use of weapons in the weapons display room. One issue on accreditation concerned college credit for courses taken at the Army Language School (ALS); this file covers 1948-1959 and was a controversial issue. Management training of faculty during 1957 and in 1962 focused on training ALS faculty; civilian and military to become more effective managers. An original German Lesson plan is included in this file group as well as memos and publications from the Training Section of the Army Language School.

The documents within boxes 03 to 06 appear to have been acquired by James McNaughton, former Command Historian at DLI, to support research for a comprehensive history of the Army Language School. Evidence suggests that at least some of these records came out of the early Public Affairs Office. However, provenance of the records however remains unclear. The records consist of the MISLS move to Monterey, formation of ALS, administration of ALS and the eventual consolidation of DLI.

Valuable historical information about the formation of ALS and DLI available within this collection consists of organizational charts, departmental timelines, instructor recruitment (including hiring issues and quality of instructors), and statistical information on the number of students graduated, retention, and costs per student.

The date range of the collection is 1939 to 1969.
