Advanced CLPM Workshop

The Advanced Command Language Program Manager (ACLPM) Workshop, hosted by the Defense Language Institute Foreign Language Center was initiated as a means of communicating current advances in the language community to CLPMs and to provide a forum for collaboration and CLPM professional development.

This ACLPM marks the 30th anniversary of the event, the first was held June 6, 1994. Over the years, the event has changed; however, the focus on collaboration and CLPM professional development remains the same.

The three-day ACLPM features several different formats and options for attendees:

- Tuesday's schedule features a keynote address, CLP support update, and topical presentations of relevance to CLPMs.
- Wednesday will include DLIFLC, Department of Defense, and Service discussion panels; the afternoon is dedicated to Service breakouts.
- Thursday morning the workshop will offer mission-focused presentations, a resource expo to showcase DLIFLC and other government-related offerings. Thursday afternoon the LREC Community will recognize the DoD and Service winners of FY23 Command Language Program of the Year and Language Professional of the Year.

Please keep in mind that DLIFLC has language classes in session and ACLPM attendees CANNOT disrupt the educational mission. Language classes begin at 0800, so the gates will be busy between 0730 and 0815.

DLIFLC Guest Network Login

- You will need access to an **email account using your phone with data turned on.**
- Your device will need to be in or near a building on DLI to get access to DLIFLC-Guest network.

1. Connect to Wi-Fi

1. From your Home screen, go to Settings > Wi-Fi.
2. Turn off Private Wi-Fi address.
3. Your device will automatically search for available Wi-Fi networks.
4. Tap the name of the DLIFLC-Guest network that you want to join.
5. After you join the network, you will see a checkmark next to the network icon in the upper-left corner of your display or the upper-right corner on most Apple products.
6. After you join the network, your browser will auto-launch and you will be directed to our Guest Registration Captive Portal webpage
7. First time users must create an account to use DLIFLC-Guest wifi network for the first time.
8. Select "**Click Here**" on Network Login page to begin account creation process.



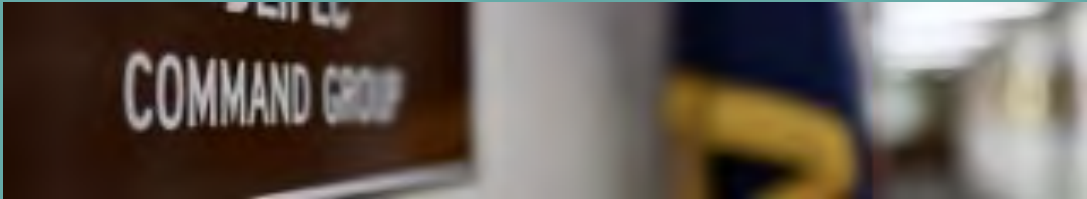
Candidates must be E-6 or below and a member of the active or reserve component, must be certified proficient in assigned control language on the Defense Language Proficiency Test (DLPT) or equivalent (e.g., OPI, etc.), must meet Service height and weight standards, and must meet Service physical fitness standards. The LPoY nominee from each Service will present a 5-minute “Best Practices” briefing to workshop attendees.

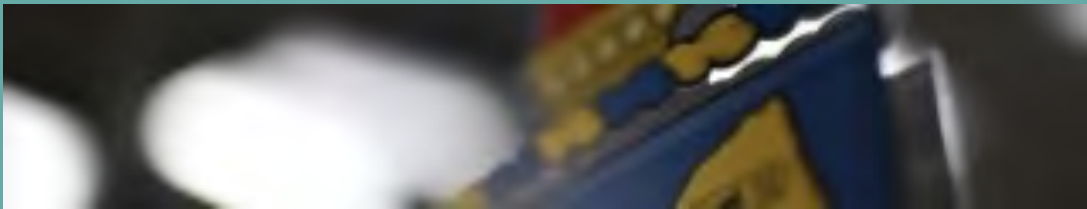
